Beeston In-Lamb Female Sale starts New Year in style

Wright Marshall were delighted to welcome Texel and Beltex Breeders from all over the UK, Northern and Southern Ireland, as well as breeders from Northern Europe, to Beeston last Saturday for the annual New Year's opener, the shows and sales of Pedigree Texel Females for The North West Texel Breeders Club, and of Beltex Females for the Beltex Society.

Trade was strong and steady throughout, with a few notable headline prices in both breeds. British breeders showed great confidence in top quality genetic lines, to the extent that several French and Dutch breeders present went home empty handed.

Texel Shearlings made to 4,500gns, 3,800gns, 2,000gns etc; Ewes made to 1,600gns, 1,500gns, 1,000gns (twice) etc; Ewe Lambs made to 950gns, 900gns etc.

Beltex Shearling Ewes made to 1,600gns; Ewes made to 650gns, 600gns; Ewe Lambs made to 1,500gns etc.

TEXEL



The rota decreed that it was the turn of the Texel sheep to be shown and sold first this year, with the show judge Rob Evans, of the Hope Valley Flock in Shropshire, tapping out his **Champion** from the **Plasucha Flock**, shown by **Robert Bennett**, Meiford, Montgomeryshire. A substitute entry, this ewe by Eden Valley Wiz Kid, and out of a ewe by Garngoer Upperclass, is an ET sister to the 18,000gn Plasucha Alys and 10,000gn Twilight Topper, and sold for **4,500gns** to the Anglesey based Hughes family.

Gordon Gray once again brought down an excellent pen of sheep from his Etrick Flock in Selkirk, with the best of his pen producing some lively bidding from UK and Irish breeders before being secured for **3,800gns** by David Houghton, for his Tophill Flock. This Clinterty Yuga Khan daughter, out of a ewe by Etrick Sir Alan was due in early February with twins to Midcombe Brigadier.

The sale also included a dispersal of the in-lamb portion of the award winning **Limestone flock** on behalf of the Weston family, Derbyshire, which attracted a huge amount of interest from breeders. Their leading shearling ewe, a Stainton Vantage daughter out of a Plattin VIP sired ewe, carrying triplets to Corriecravie Blue Moon, also attracted some lively interest in the ring, before David Roberts of Kenley, Shropshire beat off all comers to secure her for **2,000gns**.

The Sportsman Flock of Boden & Davies, Stockport, were also well represented once again, peaking at **1,700gns** for the most fancied of their shearlings. This Pant Wolf daughter, out of a ewe by the 145,000gns Knap Vicious Sid, and in-lamb to Plasucha Big Gun, made **1,700gns** to young Tom Morgan, establishing his own flock near Whitchurch, Shropshire.

Richard Wilson, Eden Valley Flock from Appleby, Cumbria has grown in stature in recent years and he produced another excellent pen of sheep, with his shearlings topping at **1,500gns** for a Bryn-Y-Coed Yogi Bear daughter, out of a ewe by Anglezarke Uno, carrying twins to Aldan Blockbuster, taken home by IP Jones, Powys.

Amongst the Texel Ewes, it was this year's show ewe from the Limestone Flock Dispersal which topped the trade at 1,600gns. A Duncryne Uber Cool daughter, out of a ewe by Cornerstone Rain Dancer and carrying twins to Eden Valley Rain Dancer Ace, she had collected several prizes last summer and made the long journey home to Banff, Aberdeenshire, with Graham Morrison.

Just behind was the best of a pen of ewes from Eden Valley, where Richard Wilson sold an Anglezarke Uno daughter out of a ewe by Deveronvale Perfection and carrying twins to Aldan Blockbuster, for **1,500gns**, also travelling home to Powys, with **IP Jones**. Another ewe from the Limestone Flock, 2016 born Killyvolgan Whizz Kid daughter, carrying twins to Cherryvale BFR, and which had been Champion Ewe Lamb in The North West Texel flock competition in 2016, sold for **1,000gns** to **A Thomas**, Whitland, Camarthenshire; **Richard Wilson** also saw another one of his ewes, a 2014 born Sportsman

Tremendous daughter, out of another ewe by Deveronvale Perfection and also carrying twins to Aldan Blockbuster, at a **1,000gns** to **Adrian Davies**, Manordeilo, Camarthenshire.

The **Reserve Champion** in the Show was awarded to the leading ewe lamb, best of a pen from **Ben Vernon's Charben Flock**, Rocester, Staffordshire. This lamb was by Clinterty Yogi Bear and out of a ewe by Tullylagan Tonka, and made **950gns** to the judge **Rob Evans**, Hope Valley Flock. Another from the same pen, this time a Garngour Alabama daughter out of a ewe by Glenside Valhalla, made **900gns** to **David Gray** of Selkirk, with another Yogi Bear daughter out of a Tullylagan Tonka sired ewe making **720gns** to C Paterson, Aberchirder, Aberdeen.

The strong demand continued straight into the **Beltex** sale, with lively bidding throughout on all stronger sheep, although it was notice able that smaller framed sheep failed to attract much interest. Hamish Currie was in charge of judging for the day, and he chose as his **Show Champion** an outstanding ewe lamb from the **Hackney and Wilodge Flocks** of Mrs Tippets' and Williams. Wilodge Donna, sired by Topflite Al Pacino and out of an imported Van't Rozenaken dam, sold for **1,500gns** to **J Jerman**, Brilley, Herefordshire. The best of the ewe lambs from Stuart Woods, **Woodies Flock** was a twin by Woodies AC Milan, out of an imported Harlembos ewe, which made **650gns** to Dermot Gallagher, County Tyrone.

Leading the **shearling trade** was the best out of another excellent pen of sheep from the **Woodies Flock** of Stuart Wood, Skene, Aberdeenshire. This Bryngroes Cyw ewe, sired by Woodies Bachelor and out of a ewe by Woodies A Touch of Class was sold carrying twins to Woodies Bojangles, and went home to Amlwch, Anglesey, with **D F Hughes** for **1,600gns**. Another Woodies shearling, this one Murrays Cherish, by Tiree Benchmark and out of a ewe by Woodies Wag, sold carrying triplets to Airyolland Chouco, made **800gns** to **H W Williams**, Corwen, Denbighshire.

The Beltex ewes were led by another one from the **Woodies** consignment, this one Withy Trees Appollina, sold at **600gns** to Beaumaris, Anglesey breeder **Cliff Parry**. By Woodies Storm, and out of a Woodies Raindrop ewe she was sold in-lamb to Aviemore Casinova.

A recipient ewe from **Stuart Wood**, carrying an embryo by Woodies Cookie Monster, out of Woodies Cleopatra, made **600gns**, with recipients carrying pedigree Texel embryos by Kelso Picasso making **400gns**. Pedigree **Charollais ewes**, scanned in-lamb with twins, made up to **400gns, twice**, from **D E Evans**, Mold.

More Lambs have been seen out in Markets this week, tilting the Supply/Demand balance back in the buyers' favour, so we expected prices to be less than last week's flyer. The stronger entry, however, allowed several of our regular buyers to obtain better orders, and therefore helped them to bid strongly on all grades and weights throughout.

As always, the most popular weights, and easiest to sell to several buyers, were 38-44kg, with plenty of quality Lambs in this weight range making over 210 p/kg. Jackie Trueman's 2 market-topping pens were both 43.2 kg, with all the Top 10 p/kg falling in that weight range. A large proportion of heavier Lambs, many from 48-53 kg, fell outside the main spec, but found some decent trade, many grossing up to over £95.

Great to see numbers about but a very real feeling that many more could easily have been handled by the packed ringside of buyers, only 14 of which managed to get their names recorded!

BASIC PAYMENT SCHEME -2018 – 2019 – KEY DATES

1st January – You can apply organic manure with a high readily available nitrogen content (for example, Slurry, Poultry Manures, or liquid digested Sewage Sludge) to grassland and tillage land on shallow or sandy soils from this date if conditions are suitable and you adhere to the quantity restrictions when applying manures.

1st January – Beginning of the year for assessing the annual amount of livestock manure applied to your land.

1st January – Start of 2019 Ecological Focus Area (EFA) period for EFA Fallow Land.

1st January – EFA period for hedges and trees in a line (which must be present all year unless newly planted) and buffer strips and field margins (which must be present all year)

15th January – EFA cover crops for the 2018 Scheme Year must be retained until at least this date.

16th January – You can apply manufactured nitrogen fertilisers to grassland and tillage land from this date if conditions are suitable.

1st February – You can apply organic manure with a high, readily available nitrogen content (for example, Slurry, Poultry Manures or liquid digested Sewage Sludge) to grassland and tillage land on all soils from this date if conditions are suitable and you adhere to the quantity restrictions when applying these manures.

28th February – Nitrate Vulnerable Zones (NVZs): End of the additional quantity restrictions related to the closed period for applying organic manures with a high, readily available nitrogen content in NVZs. The usual restriction on application rates will continue to apply.

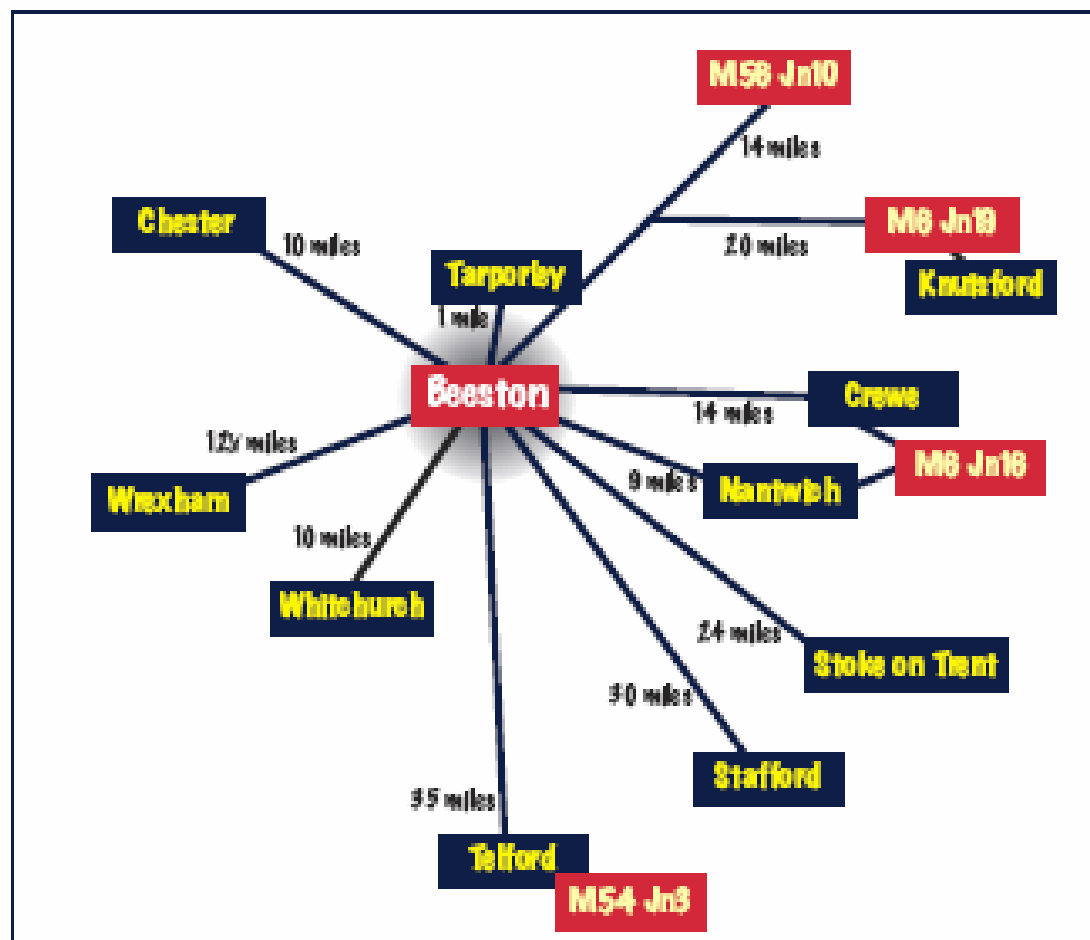
